SHAREHOLDER LETTER DECEMBER 31, 2022 (UNAUDITED)

To the Shareholders of NorthQuest Capital Fund, Inc.:

The Fund's total return for 2022 was down 26.09%, which included a \$0.219004 per share distribution paid to all shareholders on December 28, 2022. The table below compares the 2022 performances of the Fund's and the S&P 500 Index Total Return (TR) with dividends reinvested.

Major Purchases and Sales of Common Stocks during 2022

NorthQuest purchased new positions in the following common stock securities during 2022: Continental Resources Inc. (CLR), Deere & Company (DE), EOG Resources, Inc. (EOG), Alphabet Inc. Class C (GOOG), Paccar Inc. (PCAR), Tractor Supply Company (TSCO), and Advanced Drainage Systems, Inc. (WMS). See additional information about all of our company investments on pages 2, 3, and 4.

NorthQuest sold entire positions in Adobe Inc. (ADBE), Amazon.com Inc. (AMZN), Continental Resources Inc. (CLR), Dollar General Corp. (DG), Edwards Lifesciences Corp. (EW), Generac Holdings Inc. (GNRC) and Royal Gold Inc. (RGLD).

2022 Economic Issues and Portfolio Adjustments

The Fund's portfolio performance was hampered by persistent inflation, labor shortages, rising interest rates, a strong U.S. dollar, and supply chain interruptions during 2022. The following rational factored into the Fund's decision to sell the common stocks mentioned above. Rising expenses from transportation and distribution began to negatively affect the net profit margins of AMZN and DG. Labor shortages continued to interrupt hospital diagnostic testing and medical procedures which slowed revenues and profits of EW. A decline in home generator installations caused a dramatic decline in GNRC earnings. Higher interest rates caused commodity prices to fall and the U.S. dollar to strengthen dramatically against other currencies. The stronger U.S. dollar made it more difficult to sell U.S. products and services internationally. This resulted in the Fund changing its long-term views on ADBE and RGLD. And finally, CLR entered an agreement with its billionaire founder Harold Hamm to take the company private which removed CLR as a listed public company.

NorthQuest added DE, EOG, and PCAR to our investment portfolio as a way to invest in "taken for granted" industries related to food, energy, and transportation, respectively. The Fund believes that these companies will continue to embrace the latest technologies to produce superior products and services as well as attract more sales with greater profit margins.

Investments were also made in GOOG, TSCO, and WMS due to their efficient and unique operations in the businesses of "search engine technology", specialized retailing, and water management solutions, respectively.

The Fund will continue to take a long-term, disciplined, and steadfast investment approach with the goal of selecting companies that consistently and efficiently grow their sales, profits, and retained earnings. Over time businesses with these qualities have a tendency to rise in value.




The following chart gives a visual breakdown of the Fund by the industry sectors the underlying securities represent as a percentage of the portfolio of investments.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2022

1. ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Operations: NorthQuest Capital Fund, Inc. (the "Fund") was incorporated on January 3, 2001 in New Jersey and commenced investment operations January 15, 2002. The Fund is registered as an open-end, non-diversified management investment company under the Investment Company Act of 1940, as amended, and its shares are registered under the Securities Act of 1933.

The Fund's investment objective is to seek long-term capital appreciation and to secondarily earn dividend income.

The following is a summary of the significant accounting policies followed by the Fund in the preparation of its financial statements. The Fund is an investment company that follows the accounting and reporting guidance of Accounting Standards Codification Topic 946 applicable to investment companies.

Security Valuation: All investments in securities are recorded at their estimated fair value, as described in Note 2.

Federal Income Taxes: The Fund makes no provision for federal income or excise tax. The Fund intends to qualify each year as a "regulated investment company" ("RIC") under subchapter M of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, by complying with the requirements applicable to RICs and by distributing substantially all of their taxable income. The Fund also intends to distribute sufficient net investment income and net capital gains, if any, so that they will not be subject to excise tax on undistributed income and gains. If the required amount of net investment income or gains is not distributed, the Fund could incur a tax expense. Therefore, no federal income tax or excise provision is required.

The Fund recognizes the tax benefits of uncertain tax positions only when the position is more likely than not to be sustained, assuming examination by tax authorities. Management has analyzed the Fund's tax positions and concluded that no liability for unrecognized tax benefits should be recorded related to uncertain tax positions taken on returns filed for open tax years (2019-2021) or expected to be taken in the Fund's 2022 tax returns. The Fund identifies their major tax jurisdiction as U.S. Federal and state of New Jersey, however the Fund is not aware of any tax positions for which it is reasonably possible that the total amounts of unrecognized tax benefits will change materially in the next 12 months.

The Fund recognizes interest and penalties, if any, related to unrecognized tax benefits as income tax expense in the Statement of Operations. During the year ended December 31, 2022, the Fund did not incur any interest or penalties.

Distributions to Shareholders: The Fund intends to distribute to its shareholders substantially all of its net realized capital gains and net investment income, if any, annually.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) DECEMBER 31, 2022

Other: The Fund follows industry practice and records security transactions on the trade date. The specific identification method is used for determining gains or losses for financial statements and income tax purposes. Dividend income is recorded on the exdividend date and interest income is recorded on an accrual basis.

Cash and Cash Equivalents: The Fund maintains its cash in an account at a custodian bank, which, at times, may exceed federally insured limits. The Fund has not experienced any losses in such account and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on its cash deposits.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of financial statements and the reported amounts of increases and decreases in net assets from operations during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. SECURITIES VALUATIONS

Processes and Structure

The Fund's Board of Directors have adopted guidelines for valuing securities including in circumstances in which market quotes are not readily available and has delegated to the Advisor the responsibility for determining fair value prices, subject to review by the Board of Directors.

Hierarchy of Fair Value Inputs

The Fund utilizes various methods to measure the fair value of most of their investments on a recurring basis. GAAP establishes a hierarchy that prioritizes inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The three levels of inputs are as follows:

- Level 1. Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Fund has the ability to access.
- Level 2. Observable inputs other than quoted prices included in level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability either directly or indirectly. These inputs may include quoted prices for the identical instrument on an inactive market, prices for similar instruments, interest rates, prepayment speeds, credit risk, yield curves, default rates, and similar data.
- Level 3. Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability to the extent that relevant observable inputs are not available, representing the Fund's own assumptions about the assumptions that a market participant would use in valuing the asset or liability, and that would be based on the best information available.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) DECEMBER 31, 2022

The availability of observable inputs can vary from security to security and is affected by a wide variety of factors, including, for example, the type of security, whether the security is new and not yet established in the marketplace, the liquidity of markets, and other characteristics particular to the security. To the extent that valuation is based on models or inputs that are less observable or unobservable in the market, the determination of fair value requires more judgment. Accordingly, the degree of judgment exercised in determining fair value is greatest for instruments categorized in level 3.

The inputs used to measure fair value may fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy. In such cases, for disclosure purposes, the level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement falls in its entirety is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

Fair Value Measurements

A description of the valuation techniques applied to the Fund's major categories of assets and liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis follows.

Equity securities (common stocks). Securities traded on a national securities exchange (or reported on the NASDAQ national market) are stated at the last reported sales price on the day of valuation. To the extent these securities are actively traded, and valuation adjustments are not applied, they are categorized in level 1 of the fair value hierarchy. Certain foreign securities may be fair valued using a pricing service that considers the correlation of the trading patterns of the foreign security to the intraday trading in the U.S. markets for investments such as American Depositary Receipts, financial futures, Exchange Traded Funds, and the movement of the certain indexes of securities based on a statistical analysis of the historical relationship and that are categorized in level 2.

Short term investments. Short term investments are valued using amortized cost, which approximates fair value. These securities will be categorized in Level 1 of the fair value hierarchy.

3. INVESTMENT ADVISORY AGREEMENT AND OTHER RELATED TRANSACTIONS

The Fund has an investment advisory agreement with Emerald Research Corporation ("the Advisor"), whereby the Advisor receives a fee of 1% per year on the net assets of the Fund. All fees are computed on the average daily closing net assets of the Fund and are payable monthly. The investment advisory fee earned by the Advisor for the year ended December 31, 2022 was \$66,941. The Advisor has contractually agreed to decrease the investment advisory fee or, if necessary, to reimburse the Fund for expenses if and to the extent that the Fund's aggregate annual operating expenses exceed 1.79% of the Fund's daily average net assets until August 10, 2023. The Fund owed the Advisor \$5,433 at December 31, 2022 for advisory fees. There was no reimbursement for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Mr. Peter J. Lencki is President of the Advisor and is also President of the Fund.

In accordance with GAAP, the Fund recorded a permanent book/tax difference of \$30,144 from net investment loss to paid in capital. This reclassification has no impact on the net asset value of the Fund and is designed generally to present undistributed income and net realized gains on a tax basis, which is considered to be more informative to shareholders.

7. CONTROL AND OWNERSHIP

The beneficial ownership, either directly or indirectly, of more than 25% of the voting securities of a fund creates a presumption of control of the fund under Section 2(a)(9) of the Investment Company Act of 1940. As of December 31, 2022, the Portfolio manager and immediate family members, in aggregate, owned approximately 40% of the shares of the Fund.

8. INDEMNIFICATIONS

In the normal course of business, the Fund enters into contracts that contain general indemnification to other parties. The Fund's maximum exposure under these contracts is unknown as this would involve future claims that may be made against the Fund that have not yet occurred. The Fund expects the risk of loss to be remote.

9. MARKET RISK

The global outbreak of COVID-19 (commonly referred to as "coronavirus") has disrupted economic markets and the prolonged economic impact is uncertain. Although vaccines for COVID-19 are becoming more widely available, the ultimate economic fallout from the pandemic, amid the spread of COVID-19 variants, and the long-term impact on economies. markets, industries and individual companies are not known. The operational and financial performance of individual companies and the market in general depends on future developments, including the duration and spread of any future outbreaks and the pace of recovery which may vary from market to market, and such uncertainty may in turn adversely affect the value and liquidity of the Fund's investments, impair the Fund's ability to satisfy redemption requests, and negatively impact the Fund's performance.

Russian Invasion of Ukraine

Russia launched a large-scale invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022. As a result of this military action, the United States and many other countries have instituted various economic sanctions against Russian individuals and entities. The situation has led to increased financial market volatility and could have severe adverse effects on regional and global economic markets, including the markets for certain securities and commodities, such as oil and natural gas. The extent and duration of the military action, resulting sanctions imposed, other punitive action taken, and the resulting market disruptions cannot be easily predicted.

10. SECTOR CONCENTRATION RISK

Sector concentration risk is the possibility that securities within the same sector will decline in price due to sector-specific market or economic developments. If the Fund invests more heavily in a particular sector, the value of its shares may be especially sensitive to factors and economic risks that specifically affect that sector. As a result, the Fund's share price may fluctuate more widely than the value of shares of a mutual fund that invests in a broader range of sectors. Additionally, some sectors could be subject to greater government regulation than other sectors. Therefore, changes in regulatory policies for those sectors may have a material effect on the value of securities issued by companies in those sectors.

11. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated the impact of all subsequent events on the Funds through the issuance date of these financial statements and has noted no such other events requiring accounting or disclosure.

BOARD DISCUSSION ON RENEWING FUND'S ADVISORY CONTRACT

The Board renewed the advisory contract with Emerald Research Corporation (the "ERC") on August 9, 2022 (effective August 10, 2022 to August 10, 2023) for the following reasons:

Nature and Quality of Services

The Directors reviewed the nature, extent and quality of the services provided by ERC to the Fund. They considered the Investment Adviser's responsibilities in maintaining and updating its common stock securities research; overseeing daily and monthly reports furnished by the Fund's transfer agent; maintaining technology devices, updating the Fund's website, staying apprised of current political, economic, and geopolitical events, and to adhering to the ERC and Fund's Code of Ethics and compliance policies. Based on this review, the Directors concluded that they were satisfied with the nature, extent and quality of services provided by the Investment Adviser.

Investment Performance

The Board reviewed the Fund's performance. They noted that as of 07/29/2022 the Fund was down 19.34% while the S&P500 Total Return was down 12.58%. Directors examined the following data: investment category, fees, assets under management, and Y-T-D performance as of 07/29/2022. The Board reviewed the data of 12 mutual funds and compared the statistics with the Fund's data. The Board concluded that the Fund's overall performance was satisfactory.

Fees

The Directors examined the advisory fee paid to the Investment Advisor according to the advisory agreement. They compared the ERC advisory fee with fees of other Investment Advisors which have advisory contracts with mutual funds that have different investment styles. Based on these findings the Board determined that the advisory fees paid to ERC, as stated in the advisory contract, were reasonable when compared to fees charged by other Investment Advisors providing similar services to other Funds.

Profitability and Other Benefits to the Investment Adviser

The Board next reviewed ERC's financial documents, which are examined quarterly. Based on this examination, the Directors concluded that ERC's profitability and financial condition would not prevent the Board from approving the Advisory Agreement.

Economies of Scale

The Board considered information regarding the economies of scale and Fund's expense ratio. Directors took into account the size of the Fund's assets and services rendered by the Investment Advisor. Additionally, the Investment Advisor has contractually agreed to decrease the investment advisory fee or, if necessary, to reimburse the Fund for expenses if and to the extent that the Fund's aggregate annual operating expenses exceed 1.79% of the Fund's daily average net assets until August 10, 2023. The Directors decided that no adjustment to the existing advisory fee was necessary.

On the basis of this examination, the Fund's Board of Directors including all Independent Directors, unanimously approved the renewal of the advisory contract.

LIQUIDITY RISK MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

The Fund has adopted and implemented a Liquidity Risk Management Program (the "LRM Program") as required by Rule 22e-4 under the Investment Act of 1940. The LRM Program was devised to assess and alleviate the risk that the Fund could not meet requests to redeem Fund shares without significant dilution of the remaining investor interests in the Fund. The Fund considers a variety of factors such as the Fund's long-term investment strategy, liquidity classifications of portfolio investments, and holdings of cash and cash equivalents during normal and unprecedented stressful stock market conditions as part of the management and assessment of liquidity risk.

On December 8, 2022, the Board reviewed the LRM Program Administrator's annual report. The LRM Program Administrator disclosed to the Board that throughout the 12-month period ended November 30, 2022 ("Covered Period"), the Fund maintained a high level of liquidity by being primarily invested in "highly liquid investments". During the Covered Period, there were no liquidity events that materially impacted the Fund's ability to meet redemptions in a timely manner without dilution to existing shareholders.
